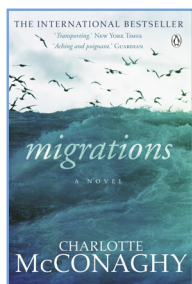


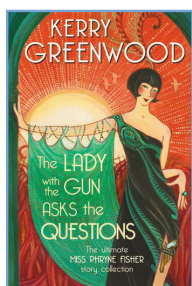

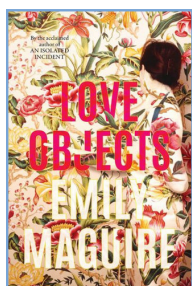
MIGRATIONS

Migrations is a shining example of what climate fiction can be. Set in the not too distant future, Franny seeks to follow the last migration of what remains of the world's Arctic terns.



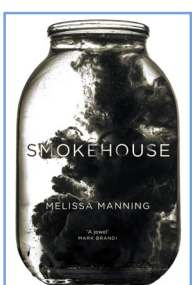
THE LADY WITH THE GUN ASKS THE QUESTIONS

The ultimate Phryne Fisher collection, with four brand new stories!



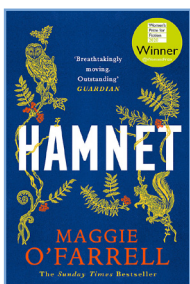
LOVE OBJECTS

Engrossing new historical fiction from Kirsty Manning. This time she's jumping between between 1940s and present-day France.



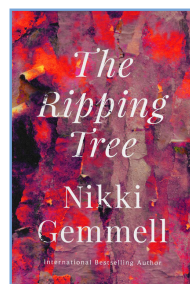
CIVILISATIONS

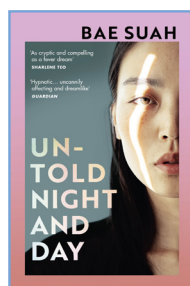
FIRST PERSON SINGULAR

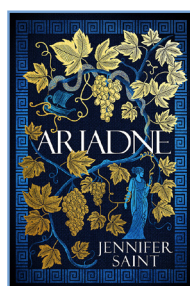
THE RIPPING TREE

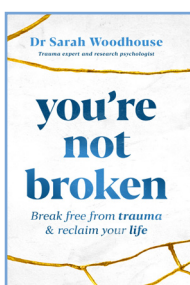

A book of remarkable scope — Stan Grant looks at the current state of the world, and offers ways forward in seemingly hopeless situations.



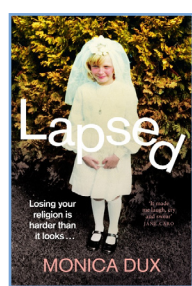
YOU'RE NOT BROKEN

You're Not Broken offers tangible, helpful advice on breaking the trauma loop, teaching you ways out of cycles of dysfunctional behaviour.



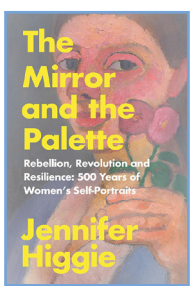
THE WOMEN I THINK ABOUT AT NIGHT
